How composting can reduce food waste

Apart from not producing it in the first place, composting is the next best way to deal with food waste. By composting at home, food waste is diverted from other forms of treatment, reducing greenhouse gas emissions from transport. Plus, the resulting compost improves soil health - a win for your garden!



St Marks Church in Horsham took part in our Hot Bin trial in 2022 and are still seeing the benefits of community composting today.

This summer, please dispose of barbecues responsibly

If you're firing up the barbecue this summer, please follow the advice from West Sussex Fire and Rescue and ask 'Has it bin long enough?' before you throw the ash or disposable barbecue in your household refuse bin.



Leave your barbecue to cool down for several hours. If it sizzles, it's still too hot to be binned!

Check opening days and book your appointment on the West Sussex County Council website.




