

**DEADLINE - Friday 1st March - Have your say on proposed development sites in Barns Green & Itchingfield.**

The [Horsham District Local Plan 2023 - 2040](#) is open for public review and comment until Friday 1st March 2024.

**Why this matters to you:**

Horsham's Local Plan defines strategy for development in the District from 2023 - 2040.

The Regulation 19 consultation is the last opportunity that members of the Public have to comment before it is submitted for examination, and subsequently, adoption.

Horsham's proposed Local Plan identifies ('allocates') 3 sites which it envisages could be developed (see page 176) in Barns Green & Itchingfield Parish. These are:

- **BGR1: Land South of Smugglers Lane, 3.3 hectares (50 homes)**
- **BGR2: Land South of Muntham Drive, 1.85 hectares (25 homes)**
- **BGR3: Land at the Old School Site, Itchingfield, 0.8 hectares (20 homes)**

It is important to note that sites corresponding with BGR1 and BGR2 were identified in the 'Call for Sites' stage of the Itchingfield & Barns Green Neighbourhood Plan (as distinct from the Horsham District Local Plan under discussion here): These sites were, after review and consultation with parishioners, **not** selected to be put forward for development. The HDC Local Plan makes no reference to the ongoing Sumners Field development which was identified as a preferred site in the Neighbourhood Plan and which will deliver 32 homes in the Parish.

BGR1 & BGR2 are shown in this map extract from the HDC Local Plan documents:
